RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ST. ANDREWS NO. 287 BYLAW NO. 80-11 A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH A HAYING POLICY

A BYLAW TO REPEAL BYLAW NO. 37-99 AND BYLAW NO. 74-08

The Council of the Rural Municipality of St. Andrews No. 287, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. For the purpose of this bylaw the expression:
 - a. "municipality means the Rural Municipality of St. Andrews No. 287.
 - b. "road" means a "public highways" as defined by the Municipalities Act.
- 2. Conditions for the salvage of hay from a road in the municipality.
 - (a) The adjacent landowner or lessee in the case of rented land, has first option to salvage hay along municipal roads. Other persons must contact the adjacent landowner or lessee to salvage the hay on or before **July 15**th, of each year.
 - (b) After July 15th, any person may cut and salvage hay without the permission of the adjacent landowner or lessee, providing the adjacent landowner or lessee has not begun salvage operations.
 - (c) All roads marked on the hay map must be cut. The right-of-way must be left in a neat appearance by the person salvaging hay and bales be left in the bottom of the ditch.
 - (d) Bales on the road or shoulder must be removed before dark the day of baling.
 - (e) The Council reserves the privilege and right for its members, employees and/or agents to enter upon said right-of-way for the maintenance and or re-construction of said roadway or for other such purposes as may be deemed necessary, and at no compensation or reimbursement to the party salvaging the hay therefrom. Verbal abuse will not be tolerated and the contract will be revoked if a Councillor of Employee of the Municipality considers it necessary.
 - (f) The municipality assumes no liability for laborers, machinery or bales relating to the salvage of hay operations.
 - (g) In order to minimize hazards to motorists, any bales not removed by August 15st may be removed by the municipality and any bales so removed shall become the property of the municipality.
 - (h) No person shall cut hay on any portion of a public highway located in this municipality during the period of one-half hour after sunset until one-half hour before sunrise.
 - (i) No person shall cut hay on any portion of a public highway located in this municipality so as to obstruct the traveled portion for the public highway.
 - (j) There will be a limit of 50 cut miles per contract. A second contract can awarded when the first contract has been completed.

3. Bylaw No. 74-08 a bylaw to amend Bylaw No. 37-99, are hereby repealed.
